Position Summary

MEASURE Evaluation is funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to strengthen capacity in developing countries to gather, interpret, and use data to improve health. The project, with offices at the Carolina Population Center (www.cpc.unc.edu) at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, seeks to establish a research position for a PhD-level Research Associate with primary responsibility for rigorous evaluation of health programs and health information system (HIS) strengthening interventions. The Research Associate will participate in all aspects of the design, implementation, analysis, and dissemination of MEASURE Evaluation rigorous evaluations and help build capacity of local and regional institutions and partners to conduct rigorous evaluation. The Research Associate will also contribute to building the evidence base for understanding what works to strengthen HIS and how these investments affect health systems and health outcomes. The position will report to the Director for Evaluation.

Education Requirements

PhD in economics, sociology, public health, or a related discipline is required. Under exceptional circumstances, a Masters' degree in economics, sociology, public health, or a related discipline with at least 10 years of experience may be considered.

Qualifications and Experience

Minimum of 7 years of professional experience in international health development (strongly preferred); thorough understanding of the determinants of health outcomes, the components of health information systems, and experience with program monitoring and evaluation (preferred); demonstrated advanced skills in quantitative methods of data analysis (required); experience in planning, management and analysis of quantitative survey data for rigorous evaluation (required); demonstrated leadership and management skills and responsibilities (required); strong writing and communication skills (required); teaching experience (preferred); ability to work effectively in developing countries (required); strong interpersonal skills, including the ability to work effectively with other project staff, funding agencies such as USAID, PEPFAR, and US-based and international colleagues (required); Fluency in English (required); A second language, particularly Spanish, Portuguese, or French, (preferred); availability to travel internationally at least 20% time annually (required).
